WWI Commemorative Bench

2014 marks the centenary of the outbreak of the First World War "The Great War".

As many of you know Buckland Filleigh played its part, as most parishes did. The War Memorial in the church yard has the names of six parishioners who did not return from the conflict, which lasted four years and claimed the lives of over 880,000 people from the Commonwealth alone.

The war touched the lives of every household in the country in many different ways. With so many men being away at the front, women had to step in and keep the country running, working in the roles traditionally taken by men. This ranged from working on the fields, keeping the country and the troops fed, and working in the factories making weapons and ammunition on a scale never seen before.

The Great War changed the country for ever. Trauma treatment advanced more than at any other time since the Romans. Industry and mass production reached new unprecedented levels. Women at last got the vote, something the Suffragette movement had been fighting for before the war. These are just a few examples of changes that happened then and we take for granted today.

To mark this centenary the Parish has placed a park bench in Buckland Filleigh's church yard, overlooking Buckland Lake. A truly peaceful view to remember one of this country's most difficult periods that must never be forgotten.

Two August Weddings in Buckland Filleigh

On 19 August 1933 my parents were married in Buckland Filleigh Church.

My mother was the daughter and granddaughter of John and Matthew Arscott who had been the blacksmiths at Filleigh Moor Gate. It would have been a relatively quiet affair attended by a few family members and friends. There would then have been a meal at the bride's home at Filleigh Moor Gate following the ceremony.

On 16 August this year Dave and I sat quietly in the Churchyard having a picnic lunch. I looked around at the 40+ gravestones bearing the names Arscott, Vanstone and Balkwill and others - all were forebears of mine.

In contemplative mood I walked the short distance to Buckland House. My husband's nephew was to be married in Buckland House that afternoon. John, the groom, had not known of my connections with the Parish when he arranged the venue. He and Daisy and most of their friends came from the London area. Buckland House proved an ideal location, the weather was benign and there was ample room for all the guests. We watched the ceremony from the first floor leaning over the balustrade. We then had scones and cream while the children and many adults were able to play games. One hundred and fifty people later sat down to a scrumptious meal. If the caterers are included, the Parish population may perhaps have doubled that Saturday!

It was good to see the House so well used, various relatives of the bride and groom spending several days there, and a strange experience for myself being involved so closely with both the past and the future. I found this quote recently "Life can only be lived forwards but understood backwards".

Renowned Authors Visit Shebbear College

Two renowned children's authors visited Shebbear College this week and gave inspiring and thought-provoking presentations to Year 8 pupils as part of the 2014 Appledore Book Festival. Christopher Edge wrote the popular children's books 'Twelve Minutes to Midnight', 'Shadows of the Silver Screen' and 'The Black Crow Conspiracy', and Lucy Jones wrote 'The Nightmare Factory' and 'Rise of the Shadowmares'. Both authors explained the many and varied ways they get their inspiration for their often creepy fantasy stories.



Christopher discussed classic authors of Victorian times such as Sir Arthur Conan Doyle, Bram Stoker and H. G. Wells and the famous characters they created. In a fun twist, using photographs of the great authors, he emphasised the importance of having a big moustache in order to become a popular writer in Victorian times. Lucy read sections from her published books and her new book, which she is still working on. She explained where she gets her inspiration for her stories and also got the pupils involved in character development which caused a great deal of excitement and produced some very creative ideas.

Enrichment Conference for 5th and 6th Form Pupils

Wow! Last Friday Shebbear College was very fortunate to host an enrichment conference for our 5th and 6th Form pupils by Dr Peter Vardy, former Vice-Principal of Heythrop College and former Shebbear College Governor. Dr Vardy is internationally renowned as a leader in the fields of Religious Studies, Philosophy and Ethics and Values Education. A prolific author and brilliant lecturer, Peter also has long experience of working with Gifted and Talented young people.



In the morning the 6th Form enjoyed two sessions with Dr Vardy; 'What is Truth' and 'Sex Matters!' followed by a debate about the nature of ethics. These were followed by two afternoon sessions for the 5th Form students; 'Education Matters!' and 'Truth in Maths and Science'. These were all challenging and thought-provoking sessions for all students and staff involved. The sessions ranged from how we are trained to shop to Socrates and the importance of free thought, from the diplomatic tensions between China and Japan over the Senkaku (if you are Japanese) or Diaoyu (if you are Chinese) Islands to the mathematics behind 'breeding like rabbits', from Auschwitz to the inner quantum reality of the human hand. There were name checks for Plato, Hawking, Darwin, Feuerbach and so many more. Dr Vardy used filmclips to help the students explore many of the challenges and opportunities involved in being human. His key point? Education is about so much more than simply exam results.

Having been worried that the 5th Form would struggle and be bored, I was delighted to see dozens of students surrounding Peter Vardy at the break, bombarding him with eager questions and queries. Truly rewarding. Well done to all those 5th and 6th Form students who grasped the opportunity they were given.
