When we look at many of our church buildings, it looks as if the church is a symbol of an unchanging world. A medieval building that has been much as it is now as long as anyone can remember.

Of course that is not quite true. The world is constantly changing – for better and for worse. Even the church building has altered over time, and certainly the church as an organisation has. It is not exempt from the changes of the world around it. And it still isn't today. Can I ask for your help with some of the changes that are going on now.

You probably know that clergy are becoming more scarce. It's been going on for many years, and the clergy there are have taken on more and more responsibilities. Here in Devon – and in many other places as well – we have now begun to look at new creative ways of doing things.

One of the crucial parts of the church's work is helping people to know God's love for them – especially at times of need, like illness or bereavement. It's not about forcing a Bible down their throats; rather, it is being there alongside people.

To a large degree, we all do that as neighbours and as family and friends. Our villages are very good at that sort of thing. But inevitably some can get missed, and sometimes there is a need for someone with a little more distance.

Across the villages here we are hoping to draw together a group of people who can be available in that sort of way. They will probably be good listeners, sensitive to people's situations. If you would like to suggest anyone who you think might be able to fulfil that role, please do let me know. Please feel free to do that in complete confidence. If it seems right to approach that person, they will, of course, have the opportunity to say 'no'. But what an encouragement to them it would be to have the endorsement of people in the community.
